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EMU SIGNS INTERNATIONAL MAGNA CHARTA AGREEMENT



EMU was represented in Salamanca, Spain on the 17th and 18th of September 2018, where the Observatory Magna Charta Universitatum was signed by the university. The international agreement has been signed by 816 universities from 86 countries. The document that

adopts the principles of academic freedom and institution autonomy has been signed by 33 universities from the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) and Turkey. At the meeting which corresponds with the University of Salamanca's 800th and Observatory

Magna Charta Universitatum's 30th anniversary, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam signed the agreement at a cloak wearing ceremony that took place before Felipe VI, the King of Spain and Letizia, the Queen of Spain. The said ceremony will also be attended (p.2)

EMU ONCE AGAIN APPEARS ON THE TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION LIST

U.K. based higher education ranking magazine Times Higher Education (THE) announced the 2018 – 2019 Academic Year World University Rankings. 1,258 universities from 79 different countries were listed in THE 2018 -2019 World University Rankings and once again Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) from the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) is the only university from TRNC appearing on the said list. Thus, having been listed in the World University Rankings for the 3rd time since the 2017 Academic Year, EMU maintains its outstanding success.

Expressing his honor and pride in EMU's remarkable achievement, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam stated that EMU ranks within the 601-800



Band in the world rankings of the said list. Putting forth the fact that success is never a coincidence and EMU continues to grow and improve, Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam concluded his words by saying that EMU is the best in education throughout the island and one of the bests in the world. Some of the best world universities including Oxford, California Institute of Technology,

Stanford, Cambridge, MIT, Harvard and Princeton also featured on the list. The ranking considers factors such as teaching, research, knowledge transfer and international outlook, citations from academic publications, international faculty, number of international students, social activities and civic involvement.

The annual report of Magna Charta Observatory will be presented to the attendees. The event will continue with a number of workshops following the lunch. The second day will be hosted by Mayor of Salamanca Alfonso Fernandez Manueco's reception in honour of

the universities. Then the attending universities will walk through the city and 31st anniversary celebrations will begin. The event will end after RTVE Chorus and Amancio Prada guitar concerts at 19:00 pm. EMU had joined the Magna Charta meeting last year in Scotland's Glasgow city and started the process to join the agreement.

The opening speeches of the event will be delivered by University of Salamanca

Rector Prof. Dr. Ricardo Rivero Ortega and Magna Charta Observatory President Sijbolt Noorda on Monday, the 17th of September 2017 at the University of Salamanca's Historical Paraninfo Building.

What is Magna Charta Universitatum?

Magna Carta Universitatum is an agreement that was signed on the 18th of September 1988 at the 900th anniversary of the University of Bologna. It was

signed by 388 rectors in Europe and beyond. It contains principles of academic freedom and institutional autonomy as a guideline for good governance and self-understanding of universities in the future. To this day, the document has been signed by 816 universities from 86 different countries. The universities that sign the document accept that universities play an important role in the development of societies and aim to adjust their vision and strategies accordingly.



TRNC PRIME MINISTER TUFAN ERHÜRMAN VISITS EMU

Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman visited the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) within the scope of the "Equal Opportunities Project" coordinated by the TRNC Youth Department operating under the Prime Minister's Office, in collaboration with EMU. The project is aimed towards high school students receiving an education at TRNC state schools. Erhürman met with the said students at the EMU Senate Hall on Monday, the 9th of July 2018 at 10:00.

Delivering the opening speech of the meeting, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam highlighted his belief that this project is very important indicating that EMU always set goals to obtain the very best. Prof. Dr. Osam concluded by wishing luck to all students involved in the project and thanking members of academic staff.

EMU Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Halit Tanju Besler provided information about the course content stating that the courses will be very useful for the students. In a speech of his own TRNC Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman



noted: "I feel like I am home. I am very happy to be a part of this project." Describing their aim as providing equal opportunities for public and private school students Erhürman relayed his belief that the high school students will be guided by the education they receive in the summer period that will cover range of different subjects.

Education will be provided to high school students

Free education courses in a range of subjects will be provided to high school students receiving an education at TRNC

state schools selected by the Youth Department according to certain criteria. During the summer, courses will be provided on subjects such as Humanoid Robot Programming and Control, Fundamental Robot Design and Application, Microcontroller Programing (Arduino), Introduction to Astronomy, Rhino, AutoCAD, Geographic Information Systems, HTML and Web Design. The education courses that will be delivered by members of EMU academic staff will be taking place on the EMU campus between the 9th of July and the 1st of September 2018.

WORLD PHYSIOTHERAPISTS DAY MESSAGE

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Health Sciences, Department of Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Chair Asst. Prof. Dr. Ender Angin released a statement on the 8th of September World Physiotherapists Day which reads as follows:

"Public health and quality of life has been increasing since the emergence of physiotherapy over 100 years ago. Physiotherapy emerged as a profession in Turkey and our country approximately 50 years ago.

A physiotherapist is defined as someone who has received undergraduate education in Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation, obtaining the necessary

knowledge and skills to become a health professional. A physiotherapist is an important component of the rehabilitation team.

In addition to the physiotherapist, such a team comprises of healthcare personnel such as a physical medicine and rehabilitation expert, specialty physicians, an occupational therapist, a dietician, an orthosis and prosthesis technician, a psychologist and a social service expert. When physiotherapists apply treatment and rehabilitation programs they make use of a range of daily exercises, neuromuscular treatment approaches, manual treatment methods, electrotherapy,

functional activity education and vocational rehabilitation techniques. In our county a physiotherapist can work at hospitals, medical centers, special education schools, rehabilitation centers, fitness centers, sports clubs and old people's homes.

On behalf of the EMU Faculty of Health Sciences, Department of Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation I wish you a happy Physiotherapists Day."



EMU ONCE AGAIN APPEARS ON THE TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION LIST



EMU is the first and only Turkish Cypriot university to appear on the list. This year only 18 out of the 200 universities in North Cyprus and Turkey were listed.

EMU Proves that Boundaries in Education Have Been Lifted Universally

Once again with its success, EMU has once again proven in international platforms that education overcomes embargoes. Having appeared in the Turkish Universities category in the previous lists during the former rankings, EMU now features in THE World Rankings list for the first time as a Northern Cyprus university. EMU also takes pride in being the only university from

TRNC having been listed in the World University Rankings since 2016 – 2017 Academic Year.

EMU Ranks 6th Along with İTÜ and METU among Turkish Universities

A total of 23 universities from Turkey and 2 universities from South Cyprus appear on the list. EMU has been listed within the top 13 universities from Turkey among other 1,000 Turkish universities and it co-ranks 6th along with İstanbul Technical University and Middle East Technical University. Sabancı University, Koç University, Bilkent University, Boğaziçi University, Hacettepe University, İstanbul Technical University,

Middle East Technical University, Anadolu University, Atılım University, Erciyes University, Gebze Technical University, İstanbul University, Akdeniz University, Ankara University, Bahçeşehir University, Çukurova University, Dokuz Eylül University, Gazi University, İzmir High Technology Institute, Marmara University, 19 Mayıs University, TOBB Economy and Technology University, Yeditepe University are universities from Turkey managing to appear in the said rankings. On the other hand, Cyprus Technology University and University of Cyprus from South Cyprus appear within the top 500 universities in the list.

New Collaboration Protocol Signed by EMU and University of Bologna

A new collaboration protocol has been signed by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and the University of Bologna that foresees collaboration in the field of Comparative Legal Systems via a joint master's program without a thesis. The said protocol was signed at the University of Bologna on the 12th of July 2018 by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and University of Bologna Rector Prof. Dr. Francesco Ubertini. In previous years, academic collaborations and student exchange programs were held between the two universities.

In a statement Prof. Dr. Osam noted: "I am very happy to have signed another historical document for our university. We have signed this protocol to further our collaboration with the University of Bologna which is always amongst the best

universities in the world. The new protocol signed with Rector Prof. Dr. Francesco Ubertini will be a milestone for our university and academia in our country. I sincerely thank everyone who contributed to the development of our collaboration."

EMU and ITU-TRNC Education and Research Campuses Sign Collaboration Protocol

A new collaboration protocol concerning the field of engineering has been signed by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and Istanbul Technical University – Turkish Republic of Northern

Cyprus (ITU-TRNC) Education and Research Campuses. The collaboration protocol was signed by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and ITU-TRNC Rector Prof. Dr. Ercan Kahya at the EMU Rector's Office on Tuesday, the 3rd of July 2018 at 10:00.

The protocol was also signed by EMU Faculty of Engineering Dean Prof. Dr. Aykut Hocanın and ITU Faculty of Electrical and Electronics Engineering Dean Prof. Dr. Serhat Şeker were signed as witnesses. Also present during the signature ceremony were EMU Vice Rector for Student Affairs Prof. Dr. Halit Tanju Besler and Vice Rector for Administrative and Technical Affairs Prof. Dr. Naciye Doratlı as well as ITU Vice Rector Prof. Dr. İbrahim Önkol, ITU-TRNC Vice Rector Prof. Dr. Serdar Kum and EMU Faculty of Engineering, Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering Department Chair Prof. Dr. Hasan Demirel.

Speaking at the signature ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam stated that they have built-up an important momentum with ITU-TRNC, highlighting his belief that they will also carry out important work in the field of engineering. Prof. Dr. Osam thanked the teams of both



universities and wished everyone a fruitful collaboration.

ITU-TRNC Rector Prof. Dr. Ercan Kahya stated "EMU feels like my second home. We are like the only university of the same city. Our relations have strengthened under Prof. Dr. Osam's management. I believe that we will continue carrying out good work together."

The said protocol aims to develop scientific, technological and educational collaboration between the two institutions. Collaboration will take place in joint fields of interests at academic units and research laboratories between students, members of academic staff and personnel.

Within the scope of the protocol, the Cognitive Systems Laboratory that will be set-up on the EMU campus will be under joint coordination of the two universities. Thereby, researchers from EMU and ITU-TRNC will be able to participate in industry and state-funded consortiums and organize international disciplinary research projects in various fields.

EMU FACULTY OF EDUCATION ONE STEP CLOSER TO OBTAINING AQAS ACCREDITATION

Prof. Dr. Allam is currently the Chair of the Communication Department of the German University in Cairo. He has numerous publications and laboratory work on antennas, microwave antennas, modern vehicle antennas, special antennas and implant antennas.

career at the age of 18 as an entrepreneur in the telecommunication sector whilst he was continuing his education. During his university education he worked at start-up initiatives, in the sales department of Vodafone and as a project manager of sales channels in a famous marketing agency. He later gained experience in international mergers and an acquisition projects at MAYLAND AG and Deloitte & Touche Corporate Fi-

nance in the field of corporate marriage. He worked for PriceWaterhouseCoopers as a strategy consultant in one of Germany's leading DAX30 companies. In 2013, he was appointed to the position of General Manager of HEINE Medizin GmbH. Geçer successfully managed the reconstruction of the company in 20 countries including business development, branding, the establishment of a sales network, supply chain man-



agement and human resources. Geçer is also the founder of the company European Turkish Business Center which provides consultancy for companies that want to expand to the European market. Since the 1st of October 2016 he is the General Manager of Lufthansa Group Turkey (Lufthansa, Swiss and Austrian Airlines). In 2017 he was selected as the most successful manager in Turcovision "Those Who Add Value to Turkey".

OPENING OF 3 NEW LABORATORIES TAKES PLACE AT EMU FACULTY OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

The "Physics 1", "Physics 2" and "Mathematics Research" laboratories have been put into service at the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Arts and Sciences. Present during the opening ceremony of the laboratories which took place at the Faculty of Arts and Sciences were EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam, Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Halit Tanju Besler, Prof. Dr. Naciye Doratlı and Prof. Dr. Cem Tanova, Rector's Coordinator Asst. Highlighting his belief that the laboratories will help add to EMU's success Prof. Dr. Özarslan drew attention to the fact that EMU's quality has been officially registered by numerous institutions and organizations such as Times Higher Education and QStar. In a speech of his own, EMU

Following a short video screening of the laboratories' preparation period and Physics Department Chair Asst. Prof. Dr. Mehmet Okcan providing information about the experimental sets of the laboratories the ceremony came to an end with a cocktail.



WORLD-RENOWNED YOUNG MATHEMATICIAN TO TEACH AT EMU

World-renowned young mathematician Dr. Arran Fernandez takes office at Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Department of Mathematics as a guest scholar. Despite being at the age of 23, Dr. Fernandez has accomplished various successes and now will teach at EMU, Department of Mathematics and Faculty of Engineering. Dr. Fernandez had the highest score at the GCSE mathematics exam in 2003 and became the youngest person ever to complete the exam with the highest score. Dr. Fernandez, began his educa-

tion on Difficult High Mathematics in 2010 when he was only 15 years old.

Completed PhD in Cambridge at the Age of 23

Dr. Fernandez became the youngest student ever accepted to an undergraduate program by Cambridge University since 1773. The prior youngest undergraduate student that was accepted to the program was the former Prime Minister of England, William Pitt, who also is renowned as the youngest Prime Minister in the history of England. William Pitt served in the office

between 1783-1801 and 1804-1805. Dr. Fernandez graduated from Cambridge University, Mathematics Undergraduate Program in January 2013 with a High Honor Degree and was awarded "Senior Wrangler" title that is given to the best mathematicians in England and which is considered as "the highest level of intellectual success". Dr. Fernandez completed his doctoral degree in Cambridge University in the field of Mathematics in 2018, at the age of 23.



RESULTS OF THE "PRESIDENTIAL SYSTEM AND PARLIAMENTARY SYSTEM WORKSHOP" EVALUATED

Extended reports of the workshop on "Ideal System of Governments for the TRNC: Presidential System and Parliamentary System" which was organised by Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Business and Economics and Dr. Fazıl Küçük Foundation in Kyrenia between 4th and 5th of May were shared with the public at a press meeting held at EMU Rector's Office meeting room at 11:15 a.m. on Tuesday, 12th of June 2018. Among notable names who attended the meeting were former TRNC Parliamentary Spokesperson and Dr. Fazıl Küçük Foundation Honorary President Dr. Sibel Siber, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam, Business and Economics Faculty Vice Dean and Workshop Coordinator Assoc. Prof. Dr. Deniz İşçioğlu, President of Dr. Fazıl Küçük Foundation Mehmet Küçük, Vice Rectors and members of EMU Board of Trustees. During the said press meeting, a booklet featuring the extended reports of the workshop was distributed to the participants.



"A Workshop of Great Importance"

Delivering a speech at the press meeting, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam, stated that the workshop was an important organisation which is closely linked with the TRNC's governance system. Prof. Dr. Osam also added that EMU is fully aware of its position as a state university and is determined to fulfill its responsibilities in the public,

political and educational dimensions. Putting forth that EMU now ranks within the 101-150 band in UK-based Times Higher Education's Young University Rankings, Prof. Dr. Osam highlighted the fact that EMU is among the league of the world's best universities. Prof. Dr. Osam concluded his speech by stating that EMU will continue to collaborate with working groups in the country regarding community related topics.

Outcomes of the Workshop Should be Taken Seriously

Former TRNC Parliamentary Spokesperson and Dr. Fazıl Küçük Foundation Honorary President Dr. Sibel Siber also delivered a speech at the said event. In her speech, Dr. Siber highlighted the problems in the current system and added that during the workshop, academicians, bureaucrats, and politicians examined causes of the current structure of the country and discussed possible solution models with great maturity and commitment. Dr. Siber also added that rather than those who thrive on desperation and hopelessness, those who support rational solutions will be needed within the society. Dr. Siber also recommended that detailed outcomes of the workshop are taken seriously by the government and evaluated at a commission consisting of officials who would take active roles in the recommended system.

Not Sustainable

Workshop Coordinator Assoc. Dr. Deniz İşçioğlu provided information on the workshop and extended conference report. Assoc. Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu stated that academicians from Italy, TRNC and Turkey provided their views on the presidential and parliamentary systems, and that the report contains summaries of their views without any interpretations. Stating that the workshop has not reached an ultimate recommendation pointing one system over the other, Assoc. Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu added that all views have been reflected in the report. Assoc. Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu concluded her speech by stating that according to the outcomes of the workshop, the current system is not sustainable and that all participants highlighted the problems in the patronage system, lack of quality and inspection mechanisms and the election system.

EMU IEEE STUDENT CHAPTER DEVELOPS MIND-CONTROLLED ROBOTIC SYSTEM



Eastern Mediterranean University Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers - IEEE (The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers) Student Chapter has added another remarkable achievement to their existing ones through their participation in one of the largest robotics competition, Robotex 2018, with their mind controlled robot system. EMU IEEE Student Chapter formerly participated in IEEE Region 8 Acceleration Program and represented EMU at the said organisation with the training they provided.

Alexander Graham Bell and Thomas Edison are among notable founders of IEEE, a reputable organisation which boasts over 430 thousand members in 160 countries. IEEE's EMU Student Chapter formerly received an award for the training they offered under the title of "Robotic

Operating System". Having organised numerous seminars, training sessions, career and technical trip organisations, EMU IEEE Student Chapter participated in IEEE Region 8 Acceleration Program and provided training on "Robotics Operation System", for which they received the second place award within Region 8 in the "University Education Category".

Mind-Controlled Robotic System Developed

IEEE EMU Student Chapter Robotic Team developed a Mind-Controlled Robotic System with the support they received from EMU Rector's Office and Electrical and Electronic Department. Through the software platform they developed on the Robotic Operation System, the team analyzed the signals they received from the

brain sensor and created an infrastructure that could control different functions, providing a controllable robot capable of performing many different functions and controlling the humanoid robot, which is the NAO Robot. Through the developed system, the electrical brain waves generated during different brain functions are detected by a sensor and classified by Artificial Intelligence algorithms after being encoded by Digital Signal Processing methods. After the classification process, it is possible to realize the desired movements on the robot by wirelessly transferring the electrical decision signals corresponding to different functions.

IEEE EMU Student Chapter Robotic Team paid a visit to EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam with the Chair of Electrical and Electronic Engineering Department

Prof. Dr. Hasan Demirel. During the said visit the team asked for support regarding their participation in the largest robotics competition of the world, Robotex 2018.

The Team to Compete in Robotex

Visiting EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam in his office at 10:30 a.m. on Monday, 28 May 2018, IEEE EMU team provided information on their project which received Prof. Dr. Osam's appreciation. Among those present at the said meeting were Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Hüseyin Özkaramanlı and Rector's Coordinator Assist. Prof. Dr. Arif Akkeleş. At the end of the visit, Prof. Dr. Osam expressed the university's full support regarding the team's participation in Robotex 2018's "Mind-Control Category" in November 2018.

EMU RANKS AS TURKEY'S TENTH BEST UNIVERSITY

The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) ranked tenth on the Nature Index universities ranking of Turkey. On the Nature Index 2017 list that covers the time period from the 1st of March 2017 to the 28th of February 2018, EMU ranked tenth leaving behind many established Turkish universities. In the 2018 Middle East & West Asia university rankings, EMU featured within the top 25 earning a Nature Index badge.

Indicating that the Departments of Physics and Biological Sciences operating under the EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences played a big role in EMU's Nature Index achievements, EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences Dean Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özarslan stated that 3 out of the 4 high quality articles were written by Department of Physics researcher academicians whilst 1 was written by a Department of Biological Sciences research assistant.

"A statement by Prof. Dr. Özarslan reads as follows: "The Department of Physics' work on Einstein's General Relativity played a big part in the achievement. The contributions of EMU Department of Physics academic staff member Prof. Dr. Mustafa Halilsoy who brought the topic of General Relativity to our country cannot be ignored. Dr. Ali Övgün and Dr. Zahra Amirabi are the authors of 3 articles that featured in European Physical Journal C. along with Asst. Prof. Dr. Tuğçe Karaderi whose obesity research featured in the Nature Genetics journal they played a big part in this success."

Highlighting that the faculty's vision regarding quality played a big part in the important achievement, Prof. Dr. Özarslan stated that similar achievements will continue and increase as the faculty continues to move within its strategic plan to reach quality goals

This database is compiled by Nature Research. Nature Index is a real-time proxy that makes institutional, national and local compilations of high quality research used to measure academic collaboration. Nature Index is

updated monthly. After 12 months, the results are published on the website www.natureindex.com in a freely accessible manner under the licensing of the non-commercial institution Creative Commons. Nature Index also publishes yearly outputs of regional, country based and institutional/ university rankings as well as an archive of tables from previous years (until 2015).



EMU FACULTY OF TOURISM RANKS FIRST AMONG TURKEY ADDRESSED PUBLICATIONS

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Tourism, successfully came first among for publications addressed from Turkey, including the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC).

Cem Oktay Güzeller and Nuri Çeliker (2018) published an academic article on "Advances in Hospitality and Tourism Research" titled "Bibliometric Analysis of Tourism Research for the Period

2007-2016". In this article, a collection of studies that focused on tourism and accommodation sectors between 2007 - 2016 including TRNC from 19 academic publications take place. (Tourism Management, International Journal of Contemporary Hospitality Management, International Journal of Tourism Research and International Journal of Hospitality Management, etc.) According to the evaluation, EMU Faculty of Tourism excelled at ranking

in first place for publications addressed from Turkey and according to the same evaluation, Tourism Faculty Member Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe also ranked in the first place as the most published article writer becoming the most productive writer. According to the research, 13.6% of the total publications addressed from Turkey (including TRNC) were published by Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe between 2007 - 2016.



PROF. DR. UĞUR ULAŞ DAĞLI, HEAD OF EMU DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE REPRESENTED EMU IN ANTALYA

Prof. Dr. Uğur Ulaş Dağlı, (Faculty of Architecture, Head of Department of Interior Architecture at Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), represented EMU at the 12th Interior Architecture Department Chairs Meeting held in Antalya. The meeting has been collaboratively organised by Akdeniz University's Faculty of Architecture, Department of Interior Architecture and Antalya Bilim University's Faculty of Fine Arts and Architecture, Department of Interior Design and Environmental Design. The Actuary Sciences Program, which will be jointly run by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Mathematics Department and Faculty of Business and Economics, Department of Banking and Finance and will start its academic life in the Fall Semester of the 2018-2019 Academic Year. The program which is the only English language Actuary Sciences program in Turkey and Cyprus aims to train qualified professionals for the sector. A meeting between the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Association of Insurance and Reinsurance Companies Executive Board and EMU regarding the program that will contribute to the development of the private sector was attended by EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences Dean Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özarlan, Business and Economics Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Eralp Bektaş, Mathematics Department Chair Prof. Dr. Nazım Mahmudov and Banking and Finance Department Chair Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nesrin Özataç. The meeting took place at the Association of Insurance and Reinsurance Companies headquarters in Nicosia.

Favorable Opinions of Sector Representatives

Association of Insurance and Reinsurance Companies' Chairman of the Executive Board Ülker Fahri stated that they are very pleased with the foundation of the new program and highlighted that they are always ready to carry out sectorial collaborations. During the meeting sectoral representatives also gave favorable opinions about the foundation of the program. There is a serious demand for actuaries from the 34 insurance companies in the sector. State institutions are also expected to hire program graduates. Wages of actuaries can reach up to 40 thousand TL per month. The Actuary Sciences Program approved by the Higher Education Planning, Accreditation and Coordination Council as well as The Council of Higher Education will proceed with private sector collaborations.

Would you Like to Become an Actuary?

The science of Actuary is regarded as a scientific discipline with an increasing emphasis on the risky economic conditions of today's world, although the foundations are based on the 1870s. In this area of science, risk assessment is made in many areas of the economy, especially in the fields of insurance and



finance, by using mathematical and statistical methods as well as dealing with finance. "Actuaries" mainly use statistics to predict non-specific events such as accidents, premature deaths and natural disasters. Actuaries are professionals who can evaluate financial risks, offer solutions, and examine the long-term outcomes of each solution. The actuary does not only evaluate financial uncertainties in the present but also in the future. Proposals for strategic decisions are made by predictions.

5th Place Amongst 10 Most Popular Jobs

EMU Faculty of Arts & Sciences Dean Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özarlan and Faculty of Business and Economics Dean Prof. Dr. Eralp Bektaş provided information about the new program which will be launched at the beginning of the upcoming term and stated that

Actuary profession is in the first five among the top ten professions in terms of finance, prestige and job satisfaction in the United States of America (USA) and Europe. Özarlan and Bektaş also emphasized that it is in the highest Occupational Security in 2017 according to News & World Report in USA, ranked 23rd place among the first 26 jobs (97.070 US dollars as average annual income).

The authority is formed by a President and the Information Technologies and Communication Board. It operates under law and has its own autonomous

budget. The authority legislates the necessary regulations that are needed for the digital transition. 5G being in the center of this transition, BTK also controls the cybersecurity and communication infrastructure both of which play an important role in Turkey's future vision.

The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) attended the "CCNA CyberSecurity Operation" education program which took place at the Lebanese University. The event which was sponsored by Cisco Systems, the world's most respected internet infrastructure firm took place between the 19th of March and the 21st of June 2018. At the program which featured the participation of 85 engineers from the Middle East and North Africa, EMU was represented by Computer Center Directorate Section Chief and Cisco Certified Excellence Expert instructor Yusuf Küçük.

After the practices and exams of the said program, 23 of the 85 participants managed to become Cisco CyberSecurity Experts and Instructors. As Yusuf Küçük from EMU was amongst the 23 successful participants he has earned the right to deliver globally sought after CCNA Cyber Operational courses. The program touched upon topics such as Security of Information and Informa-

tion Security Centers, Windows, Linux, Network Protocol Services, Network Infrastructure, Network Security Principles, Network Attacks, Network Protection, Cryptography and PKA Infrastructure and Infringement Data Analysis.

It is estimated that cyber-crime expenditure will reach 6 trillion American Dollars by 2021. According to market research this amount was 3 trillion in 2015. The same research foresees that 1 trillion USD will be spent globally on cyber security products between 2017 and 2021. In 2016, 1 million cyber security experts were employed. In the light of all of these developments it has become very valuable to form Information Security Centers in order to fight against cyber-crimes. Industrial certificate programs that teach how to defend against attacks have also become extremely valuable. The Cisco CCNA Cyber Operational program is one of these programs.

EMU'S 3RD TRNC INTERNATIONAL CHORAL




With the collaboration of Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Famagusta District Governorate, Famagusta Municipality and Famagusta Women's Development Center (MAKAMER), the 'Ayluga Pond Cleaning Event' was held on October 11th, 2018 (Thursday) between 08:00 and 10:00. The event was given great support from Kemal Serpal (Famagusta District Governor, İsmail Arter (Mayor of Famagusta), Prof. Dr. Naciye Doratlı (EMU Vice Rector: Administrative and Technical Affairs), Prof. Dr. Sonuç Zorlu Oğurlu (Vice Rector for Student Affairs), Çağan Coşkun (Environmental Protection Department, Unit Manager), Sıdıka Özdoğan (President of MAKAMER); and also from representatives from all organisations supporting the project and Namık Kemal High School students. 

However, the permanent solution to this problem would include sensitivity from our government officials and those in charge of our legislation and law enforcement. The laws should be enacted with a consideration for maintaining the ecological balance and in the future, the local authorities should take the responsibility of enforcing these laws maintaining the continuity of environmental cleanliness".

EMU Faculty of Tourism Dean Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç stated that EMU students have previously travelled to Italy, South Korea, America and the UK noting that the first student from the TRNC to go to El Cellar de Can Roca will be from EMU. Indicating that they expect this success to continue Prof. Dr. Kılıç described their aim as training chefs that will have a global impact. Prof. Dr. Kılıç noted that with over 850 students, the EMU Faculty of Tourism will continue to stand out with its different opportunities and education. Revealing that the EMU Faculty of Tourism, Department of Tourism and Hospitality

Management gained over 30 students after the 2018 Entrance and Scholarship Exam including the student who got the highest points in the Sport Special Skill Test, Prof. Dr. Kılıç emphasized that tourism education in TRNC is reaching the level it deserves as a result of their promotional efforts. Within the scope of the GAST 304 - Kitchen Planning and Design course, Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Tourism, Department of Gastronomy and Culinary Arts third year students completed their education on Rational different oven using techniques and received their certificates.

Within the scope of the course delivered by Rational Turkey Regional Sales Director Devrim Gümüşsoy, guest chefs from Turkey demonstrated different features of the Rational 5 Senses oven and cooking techniques. The Self Cooking Center learns its user's habits and preferences and can communicate with the user. Prof. Dr. Kılıç concluded by thanking Rational Turkey for their useful education.





A STATEMENT ON IODINE DEFICIENCY DISORDERS

Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Academic Staff Member and Internal Diseases Specialist Assist. Prof. Dr. Bülent Sezgin

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty academic staff member and Internal Diseases Specialist Assist. Prof. Dr. Bülent Sezgin released a statement about the Week for the Prevention of Iodine Deficiency Disorders, observed during the first week of June each year. Sezgin's statement reads as follows:

"Every year during the first week of June, various awareness raising practices are organized to draw the community's attention to iodine deficiency diseases and to prevent health problems caused by these diseases at an early stage.

Why is Iodine Essential for Body?

It is important that iodine amounts are adequate for a healthy continuation of thyroid hormone functions that govern the growth, development and energy metabolism of the body. Iodine needs increase especially during pregnancies. Iodine has an important role in the entire development and learning process, including early development of the baby's brain. Iodine deficiency is an important cause of mental development problems in children and there are many effects on children during school, including reproductive functions and reduced IQ (intelligence) levels.

Why is Iodine Added to Table Salt?

Endemic goiter and iodine deficiency are two of the major public health problems all over the world as well as in Turkey. The World Health Organization (WHO) identified iodine deficiency in 1 out of 3 of the population in the study conducted in 18 countries in the Eastern Mediterranean Region. Due to the deficiency of iodine in the nutrients, the growth of the regional thyroid gland is called endemic goiter in humans. Necessary legal arrangements have been introduced to fight against Iodine deficiency and endemic goiter and since the year 2000 the use of iodized salt has been made widespread.

Who is Under Iodine Deficiency Risk?

- Pregnant women

- People living in countries with very little iodine in their soil
- People who do not use iodized salt
- People who follow a vegetarian and vegan diet.

What are the Symptoms of Iodine Deficiency?

- Overgrowing of thyroid gland and swelling in the front of neck (goiter)
- Gaining weight
- Feeling of tiredness and weakness
- Hair loss
- Dry skin
- Problems in learning and memorization
- Low body temperature
- Lowering heart rate
- Problems in pregnancy and/or becoming pregnant
- Severe menstrual irregularities or menstrual periods

What is the Most Important Adverse Effect (complication)?

The most serious complications of iodine deficiency are the effects on pregnant women and their babies. Problems in the development of the brain, nerves, muscles, internal organs of babies may cause mental retardation in their future ages.

How is Iodine Deficiency Treated?

In order to maintain iodine amounts at a healthy level, the daily amount of iodine should be 150 µg (micrograms). This amount meets 97-98% of all iodine needs in healthy adults.

Which Types of Food Contain High Levels of Iodine?

1 egg, 1 glass of milk or yoghurt a day and a quarter teaspoon of iodized salt are observed to meet the daily need of an adult person.

Why is Iodine Deficiency Observed Frequently at the Black Sea Region in Turkey?

Most iodine deficiency is observed at the Black Sea Region in Turkey. This may be due to the frequent consumption of foods such as savoy cabbage and radish, both of which have goitrogenic (goiter producing) effects.



THALASSEMIA DISEASE

Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Academic Member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Tayfur Toptaş

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Academic Member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Tayfur Toptaş released valuable information about Thalassemia Disease, which reads as follows:

"Thalassemia and other hemoglobin diseases are important health problems creating emotional, psychological and economic burdens on millions of people. There have been major developments in the formation mechanism and treatment of thalassemia. However, the difficulty and cost of the treatment have not changed. In economically disadvantaged communities, awareness about disease is still insufficient and access to treatment is difficult. Regarding this, it is extremely important to understand how important the prevention of the disease is.

If no precautions are taken, an average of 60,000 children with beta thalassemia and 240,000 children with sickle cell anemia are expected to be born each year. This is an optimistic calculation. The real expectation is far above this. It is observed that most of these children cannot survive long term if their anemia, which is defined as the low blood red cells carrying oxygen to the blood tissues, is deep in these children, if they encounter treatment and disease related problems and if they do not receive adequate treatment. Therefore; getting appropriate treatment, access to health centers are important for long-term survival and good quality of life. Especially, in the last 25 years, the rates of thalassemia births have been significantly reduced by health education, widespread screening and genetic counseling programs around the world, particularly in countries within the Mediterranean basin.

Red blood cells that carry oxygen to tissues and organs have a structure called hemoglobin. The function of this structure is to connect oxygen. For this reason, impairment in this structure reduces the oxygen carrying

capacity of red blood cells. In addition to this, if the hemoglobin structure is impaired, red blood cells are broken into pieces either in the bone marrow or in the spleen. Thalassemia is an inherited disorder that characterized by impairments or deficiencies in the construction of protein building chains involved in hemoglobin structure. Individuals with this disease may have to take red blood suspensions regularly and consistently, according to the degree of genetic susceptibility. Some patients may not have blood-borne needs, even if they have anemia. The most severe form of thalassemia syndrome is beta thalassemia major. In these patients, anemia is prominently severe, accompanied by other problems involving many organs.

Some of these problems include the growth and developmental delays in children, the formation of new focuses that cause blood formation in tissues and organs outside the bone marrow and problems related to them (such as severe pain, impingement on organs, impaired organ functioning, etc.), spleen overgrowth, infections, problems related to the regular blood donations, cardiac dysrhythmia, cardiac insufficiency, iron overload, cirrhosis, retardation in sexual development, retardation in bone development, osteoporosis, vascular occlusions, psychological problems, heart problems, diabetes, and infection from blood products.

If these patients are not properly treated, their expected life span is between 5 and 10 years. The most important issue about the disease is prevention of the disease. For this purpose, screening of carriers and genetic counseling are important factors in the creation of a standard policy. The treatment methods of the disease are blood transfusion policies according to international standards and the removal of iron from the body. It is also very important for patients to be monitored in terms of the other side effects mentioned above. In short, through a conscious society, genetic diseases as such will diminish. "

EMU HOSTED ÖMÜR GEDİK

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) hosted journalist, artist and animal rights defender Ömür Gedik on 4th October 2018, Thursday at an event titled "Kampüsteki Candostlar" was organized by Animal Welfare Club which operates under Social and Cultural Activities Center Directorate. Ömür Gedik gave a presentation here considering animal rights.

Ömür Gedik launched a photography exhibition "Kampüsteki Candostlar" before the conference at the foyer area

of the Social and Cultural Activities Center Directorate. She mentioned that the "Animal Friendly Campus" project of EMU has to be a great example for the other universities. Ömür Gedik was already informed about the Animal Friendly Campus Project since she visited EMU last year for the same cause.

Importance of Animal Rights

At the conference which took place at EMU Activity Hall, Ömür Gedik informed the students and participants about animal

rights and how to help animals in danger. Gedik also gave information about the association she found named "Haçiko" and their work on protecting animals. Gedik mentioned that they are doing their best to close pet shops. Gedik also stated that protection of animals should not be only focused on cats and dogs, but also all other living things. Prevents Infectious Diseases

EMU Faculty of Pharmacy released a statement on hand hygiene which reads as follows:
"Hand hygiene is ensured by cleaning (rubbing) hands with alcohol-based

antiseptic products or washing hands with soap. In order to prevent the spread of infectious diseases among individuals, we need to have clean hands. If you are planning to clean your hands with antiseptic products, you need to rub hands with the said products for at least 20-30 seconds. If you are using soap for this purpose, this period should be between 40 and 60 seconds. We must pay attention to touching every part of the hand during the application of these methods. Hand hygiene is the simplest, least expensive and most effective strategy used for the prevention of infections and limiting the transmission of microorganisms from person to person or from one surface to another. During the upcoming years, we plan to raise awareness among the students of EMU regarding the importance of hand hygiene.



EMU CONTINUES TO BE A PARTY TO HOPE
